

Monthly Summary – November 2017

November 2017 saw a **rise in the number of attacks: 84** (including 72 firebomb attacks), compared to 71 in October.

In Judea and Samaria, 53 attacks were executed in November, compared to 50 in October. **29 attacks** took place in **Jerusalem**, compared to 17 in the preceding month. **One stabbing attack** was executed **within the Green Line**, similarly to October's events. **One attack originated from the Gaza Strip and the Sinai Peninsula** in November, compared to three in October.

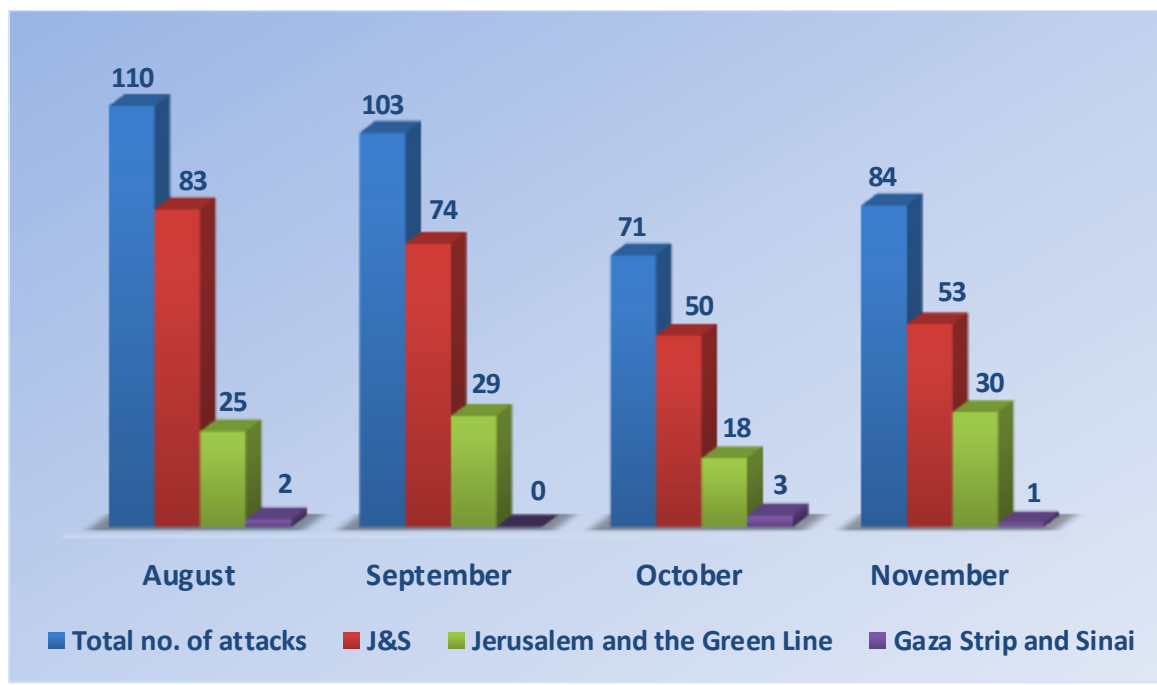
An IDF soldier was killed in a stabbing by a terrorist in Arad (30 November). **Two Israeli civilians were injured** in a vehicle attack at Gush Etzion Junction (17 November).

Data on Terrorist Attacks in November 2017

The distribution of terrorist attacks by region was as follows: one attack from the Gaza Strip and the Sinai Peninsula (three attacks in October); 53 attacks in Judea and Samaria (compared to 50 in October); 29 attacks in Jerusalem (17 in October); and one attack within the Green Line (one in October as well).

In November, as in previous months, most of the attacks in Jerusalem and J&S (72 out of 82) were **firebomb attacks**. In October, 58 out of 67 attacks in these regions involved firebombs.

Distribution of Attacks Compared to Preceding Months:

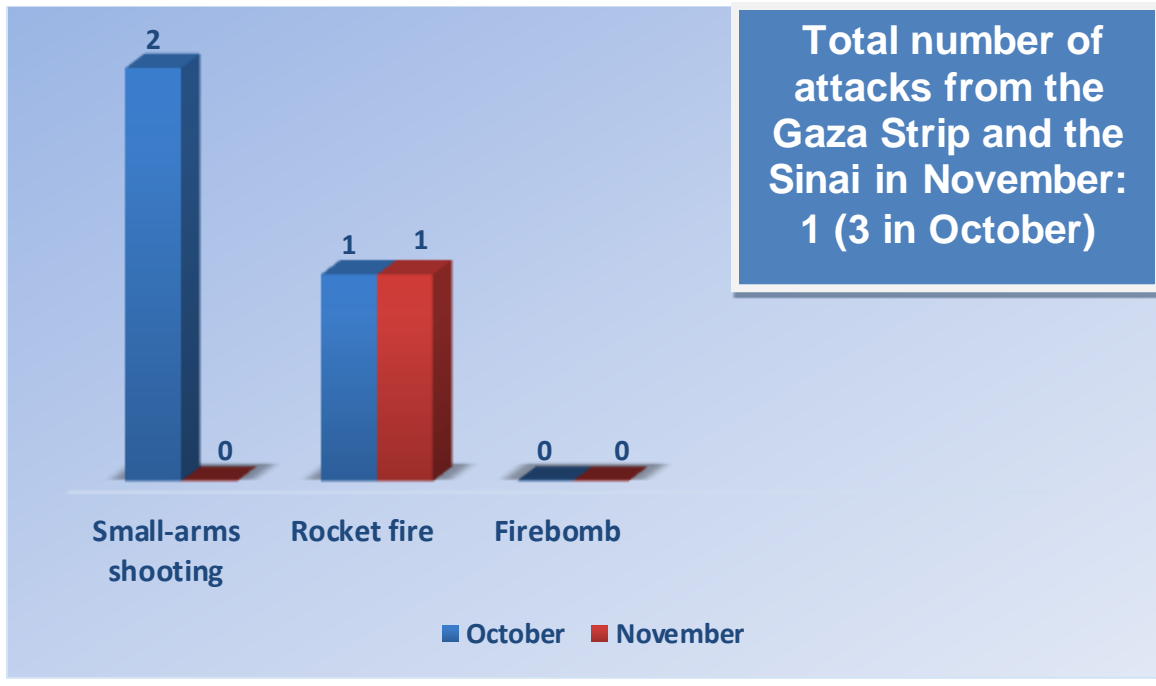


Distribution of Terrorist Attacks in November by Region and Type of Attack

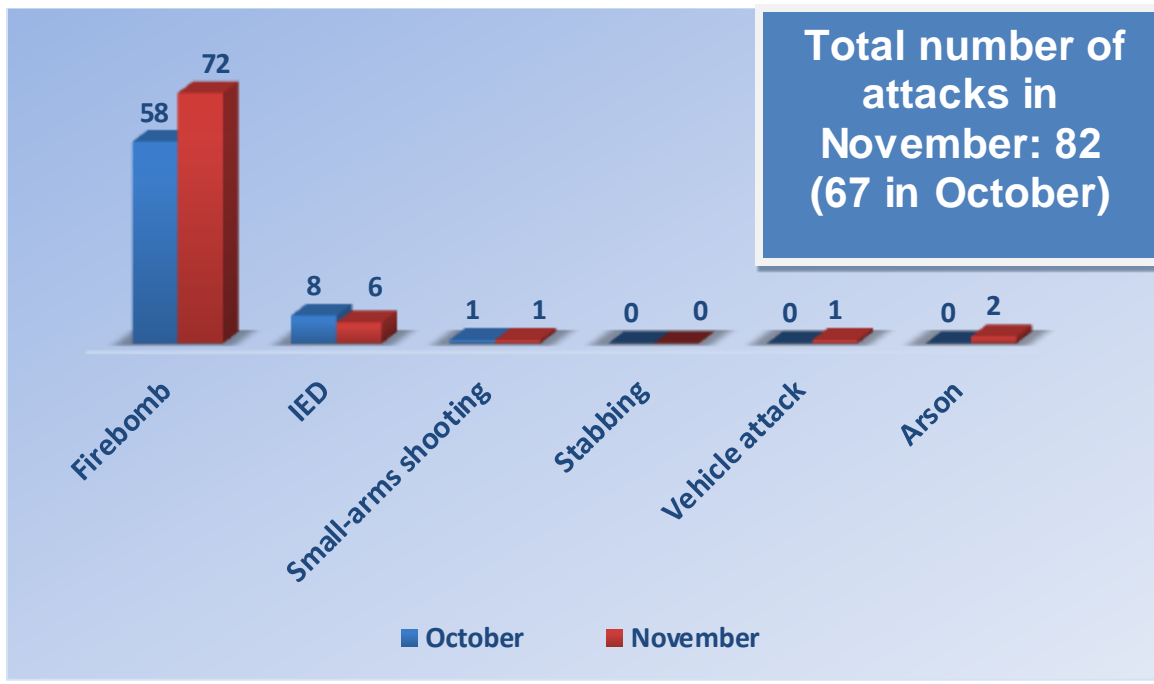
In Jerusalem and J&S – 82 attacks: six IEDs (including improvised grenades and pipe bombs); one instance of small-arms shooting; one vehicle attack; two arsons; and 72 firebomb attacks (29 of them in Jerusalem).

In November 2017, one rocket-launching* attack (using 24 mortar shells) was directed from the Gaza Strip at Israel. In October, one rocket-launching attack was directed at Israel from the Sinai Peninsula.

***Clarification:** The number of launchings is the number of rockets/mortar shells actually launched during one high-trajectory fire attack. For example: one attack may include a salvo of three launchings, that is, three rockets/mortar shells, and so it will be counted as one attack and three launchings.
